**Amazon: Before You Click,
Think About the Impact**

As I write this in mid-December, San Francisco is enduring Amazon's latest experiment. There are billboards surrounding the City advertising one-hour delivery. Gone are the many big green trucks of last year's attempt to deliver fresh groceries. Now we see many little white vans with the Amazon "frown" on the side. They are busy trying to live up to Amazon's latest delivery promise. And I have to admit, they seem to be doing a pretty good job. But before you click, think about the impact on local businesses and our local economy. Your choice matters. Thanks to the research done by our friends at the Institute for Local Self-Reliance (www.ilsr.org) I can present the following information to you:



- **Jobs.** Amazon creates less than half as many jobs as local businesses do. For every \$10 million in sales, Amazon employs just 19 people. In contrast, independent retailers create 47 jobs for that same \$10 million.
- **Taxes.** Yes, Amazon is finally collecting sales tax in California. But in addition to sales taxes, local businesses pay property taxes and other local fees for storefront locations, which is money that recirculates in our local economy and contributes to our collective well-being.
- **Local Economy.** Remember, every dime you spend with Amazon benefits their shareholders and Seattle where they are headquartered. That's cool perhaps if you have relatives or friends who live there. Otherwise, remember that local businesses feed and support your local

community. We hire locally and have local supply chains where we purchase goods and services. Frankly, about half of every dollar we reap in sales is plowed back into the local community one way or another.

• **Community.** Amazon contributes nothing to our local nonprofit organizations and schools. Studies show that locally owned businesses give almost twice as much to the local community as big businesses in general. I know the depth of COLE HARDWARE's support and involvement in our local communities. And I know of many other local businesses that are equally involved.

Your local retailers know you are going to shop Amazon. But think about the impact before you

click. If San Francisco consumer spending shifted just 10%, San Francisco retailers would create nearly 1,300 jobs and pump more than \$190 million into our community, and imagine those numbers applied to Oakland and the greater Bay Area. (Don't take my word for it. Check out the study at <http://sfloma.org/Studies>). So, what's the message? If you click 10% less and move those purchases to your favorite locally owned stores, our community will benefit immensely:

you'll help create jobs and keep our neighborhoods vibrant. Resist the urge to shop Amazon. Think about it before you click.





In the Garden February Garden Tasks

Tips from Our Garden Guy

Depending on how rainy this month is, the sunny breaks we have between storms should provide ample opportunity to get out in the garden. Not only is gardening therapeutic, it is also good exercise. So if those well-intentioned New Year's resolutions about exercising are becoming a distant memory, get some activity by planting fresh herbs, such as parsley, basil, and thyme, which can help fight disease by building up your immune system.

✓ **Roses and fruit trees:** Continue planting bare-root roses and fruit trees this month.



✓ **Irrigation:** To conserve water after the rainy season, install a drip irrigation system and group plants with similar water needs together.


✓ **Earth-friendly gardening:** Begin less-toxic disease management.

If a certain plant has repeatedly been susceptible to disease, instead of spraying, consider crop rotation by choosing a different plant or crop in that area.

✓ **Prune:** Finish pruning trees and vines. Prune flowering trees and shrubs such as flowering cherries, quince, and forsythia and use the pruned branches for arrangements in your home.



✓ **Vegetables:** This is a good time to plant certain vegetables, such as lettuces and other leafy greens. These seeds can be simply sprinkled into the ground.



Peas are best grown in these cooler months, and broccoli can handle a touch of frost. Others to consider planting in your garden now are asparagus, artichoke, rhubarb, and potatoes.

✓ **Indoor vegetables:** For a successful summer harvest, start tomato, eggplant, and pepper seeds indoors in seed trays near a sunny window toward the end of the month. Choose varieties that will do well in a cool summer climate.



✓ **Weed:** Continue to pull winter weeds as they emerge. Weeds, including their roots, are easiest to pull right after a rain.



✓ **Mulch:** Apply a thick layer of mulch between plants to slow weed germination and growth between weedings. Also consider sheet mulching as an alternative to herbicides. (Sku 75958, \$6.99)

✓ **Frost:** We often experience frost in February and March. Watch the weather forecasts and protect susceptible plants with a cloth covering if needed.

✓ **Lawns:** Help keep your lawn healthy by applying a thin layer of organic matter such as steer manure or compost. (Steer Manure: Sku 7204084, \$2.99; Compost: Sku 746014, \$18.99)



✓ **California natives:** Sow seeds for native flowers like California poppies, tidy tips, and lupine. Plant native grasses and shrubs such as California lilac (Ceanothus) and California fescue grass.




✓ **Pests:** Keep after snails and slugs with Sluggo®, which



is safe to use around pets and wildlife. Available in assorted sizes, including 1 pound (Sku 7117120, \$10.49) and 2½ pounds (Sku

7096258, \$19.99).

✓ **Houseplants:** Your houseplants may notice the longer days and begin growing. You can begin feeding them again, but dilute your fertilizer mix by 50% until growth is robust. If we get rainy days, treat your houseplants to a day outside to drink up their water that way.

Keep Your Garden Tools in Shape!

It's winter and the plants are resting, so now is a perfect time to take care of those tools you've been using all year. Good garden tools will give you many years of service, given proper care. Here's what to do to make them last:

- Clean tools off after using them. This does not have to take long—simply hose down and quickly brush off soil with a stiff brush. Periodically give metal parts a “once over” with a wire brush and wipe with oil to fend off rust.
- Treat aging wooden handles with boiled linseed oil or varnish (as many coats as the wood can take).
- Sharpen edges of hoes and shovels with a file (file in one direction only, toward the outside of the edge, following the original angle). An abrasive disk attached to an electric drill is useful for more thorough sharpening (be sure to wear eye protection).

- Protect tools from the elements when not in use. If you arrange a place for each tool to hang, you'll be more likely to return it to its “home” when the job is done.

Tessa's Tasty Temptations

Our Rockridge store manager, Tessa, is also our resident baker, and many of you have probably tasted some of the incredible birthday cakes she's baked for Dave's birthday celebrations over the years. Tessa will now be sharing some of her recipes with us for all to enjoy!

Want to make a Valentine's Day treat that will impress, but don't have a lot of time or aren't an experienced baker? Look no further than this flourless chocolate cake recipe! It takes less than an hour to prepare and bake, and it will pair well with champagne or red wine.

FLOURLESS CHOCOLATE CAKE

Ingredients

- 4 ounces bittersweet chocolate (chips or bar)
- 1 stick (1/2 cup) unsalted butter
- 3/4 cup sugar
- 3 large eggs
- 1/2 cup unsweetened cocoa powder
- Additional cocoa powder or powdered sugar to dust top

Preparation

• Preheat oven to 375°F and butter an 8-inch round baking pan. To make it extra special, you can use a heart-shaped pan. (Sku 641000, \$13.99)

• If using a bar of chocolate, chop into small pieces. In a double boiler over barely simmering water (or in the microwave on low), melt chocolate with butter, stirring until smooth. Remove from heat and whisk sugar into chocolate mixture. Add eggs and whisk well. Sift 1/2 cup cocoa powder over chocolate mixture and



whisk until just combined. Pour batter into pan and bake in the middle of the oven for 25 minutes, or until top has formed a thin crust. Cool cake in pan on a rack for 5 minutes and invert onto a serving plate.

- Dust cake with additional cocoa powder for a stronger chocolate flavor or with sifted powdered sugar for a sweeter taste.

Weathering the Storm

The cities of Oakland and San Francisco are encouraging residents and business owners to expect above-average rainfall and strong winds this winter. Public works crews are making advance preparations to help mitigate storm-related impacts. During big storm events, crews and emergency personnel will be working around the clock, but they, along with other crews around the region, may be overwhelmed, so you should plan ahead to have the supplies you would need in any emergency. Simple preparation steps taken now can go a long way toward lessening the impact of weather emergencies. Review emergency plans and prepare your family, home, and vehicle.

In Oakland, more information and resources for winter storm preparedness are available at www.oaklandnet.com/EINino. (For those without Internet access, preparation tips are available by calling 510/444-CITY.) While on the website, subscribe to receive Oakland's emergency e-mail and text alerts, so you can stay informed. You can help minimize flooding in your neighborhood by participating in the Adopt a Drain program. Join the volunteer program to keep a storm drain near your home or business free of debris. By keeping storm drains clean, you help prevent flooding of streets and sidewalks, allowing crews to focus on critical storm-response activities. To report storm-related emergency issues on public property and in the public right-of-way (such as flooding, mudslides, and landslides onto streets or sidewalks), please contact the Public Works Call Center directly at 510/615-5566. For other nonemergency requests for services on public property and in the public right-of-way, please contact the Call Center by e-mail (opwcallcenter@oaklandnet.com) or online (www.oaklandpw.com).

In San Francisco, resources are also available before and during the upcoming storms. To help prepare and minimize the risk of flooding, San Francisco officials recommend that you be proactive by inspecting your property for any leaks and other issues, developing your emergency plans, and assembling an emergency preparedness kit. People living in low-lying areas are especially encouraged to use the resources below.

Working to keep your street litter-free will help reduce debris entering and clogging storm drains. Merchants associations and neighborhood groups in San Francisco are encouraged to join the Adopt-A-Street Program. You can receive supplies such as brooms, rakes, and trash bags from the Public Works department to aid in your efforts. PRODUCT KNOWLEDGE

If I Had a Hammer . . .

Probably the oldest tool known to humankind, dating back over 2 million years, the venerable hammer has proven that it has staying power. It is arguably the most important and basic tool used on a daily basis. Although the materials used in the construction of a hammer have evolved over time, the basic design has not changed a whole heck of a lot. Function, durability, and ease of use are the main qualities to consider when choosing a hammer.

Anatomy of a Hammer

Head: Hammer heads are commonly made of forged, heat-treated, high-grade steel. Mallets (technically part of the hammer family) have wooden, rubber, or plastic heads.

Striking Face: These range from the smooth face most often found in multipurpose claw hammers, to the milled/checkered face of a framing hammer, which grips the nail head and reduces glancing blows. The double-faced dead blow (one face steel, the other rubber) and the massive hit-the-side-of-a-barn face of an engineer hammer or sledgehammer are other face variations.

Claw: Claw hammers are named after the two narrowing “claws” of steel opposite the striking face. The slot between these two claws looks like a thin “V” and is used to grip and pull nails. The two common types of nail hammers both have claws, but in different configurations. Curved claw hammers allow you to pull nails using an easy rocking motion, as the curve acts as a fulcrum. Straight claw hammers, commonly called rip hammers, are designed to rip apart nailed structures.

Handle: The stiffer the handle material, the more the force of your blow will be delivered directly to its target. However, more flexible materials absorb shock and thus reduce stress on the user’s hand, wrist, and arm. Most folks who hammer a lot prefer

wooden (usually select hickory) handles for their superior shock absorption. Stiffer handles such as fiberglass, steel, or graphite are commonly jacketed with a cushion to absorb some of the shock.

Hammer Types

Hammers come in many different shapes and forms. COLE HARDWARE offers a variety of all of these styles of hammers, and if you require a specialty hammer that isn’t in stock, we can special order it for you.

Nail Hammer: Used for general carpentry, household chores, and nail pulling; should be used only with nonhardened, common, or finishing nails. A curved claw offers leverage in removing nails and can also cradle a two-by-four.



the opposite end instead of a claw.

Sledgehammer: Used for jobs where great force is required such as breaking up concrete or driving heavy spikes. Double-face sledgehammers feature two identical faces; single-face sledgehammers have one flat face for striking and one wedge-shaped face for splitting wood.

Hand Drilling Hammer: Has short handles and is used for pounding hardened nails into concrete or for using with tools that drive nails and pins into concrete or brick.

Mallet: Has rubber, plastic, wooden, or rawhide head and is used to drive chisels or hammer joints together. These are used where a metal hammer might damage a surface and are available in a variety of shapes and sizes for specific tasks.



Specialty Hammers

Soft-Face Hammer: Used for assembling furniture, setting dowels, and wood projects that require nonmarring blows. Most feature a soft and hard replaceable head.

Bricklayer’s Hammer: Used for setting or splitting bricks and for chipping mortar from bricks. They feature a curved, chisel-like pick and a small, square striking surface.

Shingler’s Hammer: Drives roofing nails, assures proper shingle spacing, and trims composition and fiberglass shingles.

Drywall Hammer: Used to score, sheet, and set nails for drywall work. Features a scored head and a notched blade instead of a claw; the notch in the blade removes exposed nails.



Rip Hammer: Used mainly by professionals for ripping apart wooden components and demolition work. These are available with milled or waffled faces to grip the nail head and reduce the effect of glancing blows and flying nails.

Finishing Hammer: Used for general carpentry, finishing, and cabinetmaking; smooth striking face so errant strikes don’t leave marks on wood.

Tack Hammer: Used for furniture upholstery and to drive small nails and tacks. The round face is designed to pick up nails and tacks, while the narrow square head is used to drive them. These often come with a magnetized head.

Ball-Peen Hammer: Used with cold chisels for riveting, center punching, and forming unhardened metal work. They are designed with a regular striking face on one end and rounded or half-ball on

Basic Hammer Wielding

- Hold the hammer firmly, as far away from the head as you can hold it and still have a good grip.
- For full driving power and to protect your wrists from injury, swing the hammer from your elbow.
- Keep your eye on the target while swinging and strike the target squarely.
- For safety, wear eye protection and avoid glancing blows.

When selecting a hammer, first decide what kind of hammer your job requires and the handle type. Consider if the hammer is the right weight for you, how it is balanced between the handle and the head, and how the handle itself feels in your hand. These factors are not just about the pleasure of using a well-designed hammer—if you plan to use it for hours at a time, good design will reduce fatigue and minimize strain.
