## Q&A with Laurie


Cole Construction, then Commercial Sales, then Cole Fox, then Polk Street. I have been at Mission Street for about nine years.



## In the Garden with Rick

### September Garden Tasks

In the Bay Area, we often enjoy our most pleasant weather this month—an ideal time to work in and enjoy your garden. Think ahead also for the spring months and what blooming plants you can work into your growing areas for some holiday color. Consider permanent landscaping: trees, shrubs, and native plants do especially well when planted in our warm autumn soils and allowed to take in the winter rains.

✓ **Mums:** These hardy flowers will give your garden some fall flair if planted now.



✓ **Evergreen hedges:** A final trim will assure a neat overall look for winter.



✓ **Dahlias:** Delightful dahlias are best suited for a sunny spot with well-drained, fertile soil. If your soil is claylike and


heavy, work in up to four inches of manure or compost a couple of weeks before you plant. Fertilize with a balanced 5-10-5 mix monthly as plants start to grow. Do not use a high-nitrogen mix of fertilizer, those with a higher first number, as you will sacrifice flowers for leaves. A general garden fertilizer will work. We offer E.B. Stone™ All Purpose Plant Food. (Sku 745032, \$7.99)



✓ **Spring bulbs:** Buy and plant daffodils, lilies, and hyacinths in September or early October. Tulips do better when planted

at the end of October.

✓ **Garden seeds:** Gather seeds from perennials and annuals. Place them in brown paper bags to dry out for a few days; then catalog and store them in envelopes.



✓ **Water trees:** Keep all trees, especially citrus, well watered. As citrus is mostly water, those planted in containers need watering almost daily. Citrus plants will get their last feeding this month. We recommend Citrus Tone®. (Sku 7208671, \$6.99)

✓ **Garden tools:** Keep your tools in good shape by cleaning with soapy water after each use. Mineral oil will remove any sticky sap. After cleaning, lightly oil them before storing in a protected place.



✓ **Winter vegetables:** Unless it is still very hot,



plant winter vegetables such as broccoli, brussels sprouts, cabbage, leeks, radishes, snap beans, and spinach.

✓ **For the birds:** Birds eat a lot of garden pests that would otherwise feast in the garden. Consider a bird bath or bird feeder to attract them.



✓ **Fertilizers and pesticides:** These should never be applied during the heat of the day, even if they are nontoxic.



## Design + Build: Tips from Shanta

There are many benefits to a design + build relationship between a homeowner and a contractor. We asked our contractor Shanta to come up with some points of consideration for homeowners to take into account. Although the following is just the tip of the iceberg, it is crucial information for a homeowner to consider.



Whether a relatively small job, such as a custom-built bookcase, or a full house remodel with multiple additions, clients always want to be comfortable with their contractor and want to know the people "invading" their home.

Besides being respectful and honest, you want to make sure that your contractor also possesses these skills and characteristics:

- The appropriate skills to get the job done well, on time, and on budget



- A relationship with subcontractors and material suppliers who reflect the same core values as the contractor
- Sensitivity to protecting, at all times, not just clients and their belongings, but their kids, pets, neighbors, and neighborhood

Many architects can produce fantastic transformative designs that thrill clients about their home project. But when the project is put out to bid, many homeowners are shocked at the actual costs associated with that beautiful design. All too often architects might be unaware of the actual costs in implementing their designs.

Having a qualified builder involved in the process from the beginning to assist with the design and construction costs will offer the best path to getting



the architectural vision realized. In a design + build relationship, the contractor meets with the architect and owner at agreed upon critical points throughout the design process to help the process run smoothly and stay on track. Along the way, the contractor can also advise on certain design

components and offer alternate ideas that may accomplish the architect's vision at a much lower cost.

During this process, the homeowner and architect are developing a firsthand relationship with their chosen contractor. For all parties involved, it is much better to find out if the builder and owner are a fit during the design process than to find out the relationship is problematic when the job is already under way.

A qualified contractor who assists with the design and cost component may not necessarily be the best builder for the client. But at least the client has been led down the proper budgeting path. Regardless of how the initial owner/builder relationship



works out in the design and cost phase, the owner can still put the project out to bid when the plans are completed. Paying a builder in the design phase is well worth the preventative measures up front, rather than paying much more down the road.

Another added benefit to having early builder feedback is getting a sense of how a qualified builder thinks about a wide range of topics:

- How does the builder respond to problems and emergencies?
- How does the builder treat his or her associates and employees?
- How does the builder deal with extra and unforeseen work?

# Meet Chris: Plumbing and Heating Owner/Operator

Born and raised in the Sunset district, Chris runs a small, 22-year-old plumbing outfit in San Francisco that employs a core group of plumbers—most of whom have been with him for over 15 years. Because Chris has spent his entire life in San Francisco, he understands City plumbing!

Chris puts a lot of trust in his plumbers to educate customers so that their needs are treated properly, and therefore, they're not spending money needlessly. Many plumbing outfits in the City charge customers for estimates and pay their plumbers on commission, giving their plumbers incentive to charge for projects, such as installing new pipes, that may not be necessary. Oftentimes a customer is quoted an excessive amount to replace sewer pipes, but older sewers can be maintained rather than replaced most of the time.

Sewer problems are usually caused by tree root invasion. Chris and his team can often de-root the sewers instead of replacing them. Collapsed sewers are a different situation, and most likely they will need to be replaced. Chris advises all customers to get at least two estimates before proceeding with a sewer replacement.

Chris and his crew can handle just about every type of plumbing project, and they do a lot of servicing of existing plumbing.

Remodels, copper pipe replacement, water heater replacement (including on-demand tankless), and furnace replacement are some of the types of projects Chris and his team specialize in.

When the sewer is clogged and not flowing, Chris and his team will snake or jet out the main line to clear it. At that point they will offer a free camera inspection to see if there's a problem with the line such as cracks, breaks, or roots. A cable that looks like a snake but has a camera on the tip is inserted down the line. It also has a locator attached to it so that it can be determined to within a quarter inch how deep and how far into the line it is. The client can see all this happening on a color monitor.

## The Meanings of Color

**YELLOW:** Connected to sunlight and warmth, yellow reflects enlightenment, all things Zen and spiritual. Yellow is known to alleviate seasonal affective disorder, and houses painted yellow sell faster than those of other colors. It is also a popular choice for children's rooms and kitchens.

**PURPLE:** Once associated with royalty, purple is now seen as a fashion color for both men and woman. Purple tones with a hint of red are more sensual and dynamic, while purple shades skewed toward blue suggest mystery and magic.

**AVOCADO:** A perfect example of how color perceptions change over time, avocado can be seen as "cool" to younger generations who have no recollection of the appliances and shag carpeting that dominated homes in the 1970s.



## Great Grilling

In the Bay Area, we often enjoy our warmest weather in September—the ideal time to host a backyard barbecue for friends and family, although our mild climate really allows us to cook outdoors year-round. ### Go Fishing!

While just about any food can be cooked on a barbecue, probably steaks, burgers, and chicken are the foods most synonymous with grilling. For a change, try cooking up a whole fish. Red snapper, sea bass, or trout are excellent choices to try barbecuing whole. Serve up on a platter over a bed of rice and topped with lemon slices for a stunning centerpiece for the picnic table.

You can't really go wrong with seasonings. Just about any seasoning can be added to the cavity

of a scaled, cleaned fish: pepper, olive oil, lemon, lime, thyme, garlic cloves, rosemary, parsley, onions, and tomatoes.

If you're cooking the fish directly on the grill without a basket, be sure to rub olive oil on the outside to minimize sticking. Fish cooks quickly, and you can insert a metal skewer into the thickest part of the fish to test if it is cooked thoroughly. When you remove the skewer, it should come out warm and with no resistance.




### Gas Grills






