Home Accessibility

People are living longer these days, and this, plus factors such as medical advances, means that more of us are living with disabilities, too. Hazards in the home are responsible for about a third of the injuries suffered by older adults, and people with impairments may face difficulties-and barriers to

independent living—in their own environments. The definition of "aging in place" is growing older without having to relocate from your home to a facility due to unresolved access issues in the home. As we grow older, we don't want to lose our independence and have to rely on someone else for our needs.

These are the facts:

Seniors are happier and more content if they are able to live the majority of their lives in familiar surroundings.



- Aging in place enables you to perform as many activities of daily living (ADL) as possible on your own.
- Over the years, we build friendships with our neighbors and do not want to lose the security those relationships provide. Being able to remain at home for many of our later years, enjoying the familiar rhythms of life, is a true gift.
- · Seniors are often the most stable influence in our neighborhoods. They have a sense of history, and they pay attention to the neighborhood. If forced to move to a facility to resolve accessibility issues or to find adequate and affordable health and housing services, our communities lose this positive, stable influence.
- When individuals become increasingly dependent on care, or are unable to maximize independence because of restricted abilities, they are more likely to live shorter, less productive lives of decreased quality. The loss of freedom and mobility can cause depression and confusion—accelerating health deterioration.
- A long-held assumption contends that as individuals grow frailer, they require a continuum of senior living facilities-physically moving from one residence to another as health service needs change. There is growing acceptance of the aging in place concept that older persons do not need to relocate as their needs change. Modifying the living environment, adding supportive services, and reconfiguring the residence will actually cost less financially and emotionally than moving.
- With life spans expected to reach into the nineties and beyond during the next couple of generations, aging in place will become a fact of life that will influence the way we build our homes, design our appliances, and consider our bathing needs. Aging in place considerations can begin with the final home purchase when retirement age is reached. Or better yet, it can begin with the first home purchase with an eye toward the future.

Comfort and safety, not age and disability, should always be the focus. You don't have to be elderly or have a physical disability to have a bathing issue. Simple modifications to the home today, such as accessible bathing, kitchen modifications, and space for mobility can be useful for everyone, today and certainly tomorrow. It therefore makes sense to observe household habits, identify problem areas, and make changes that will help create safer, more accessible living situations.



 Marigolds: These flowers will repel many pest insects and are especially good to plant in your vegetable garden.

✓ Vegetables: Plant seedlings of heat-loving vegetables such as melons, peppers, and squashes to be harvested in the fall.

Grow Herbs!

Herbs can be used in a variety of ways in the kitchen, medicinally, and ornamentally. For example, basil adds flavor to salads and sauces, tea made from chamomile soothes the whole body, and lavender will freshen any room with its beauty and scent. Growing your own herbs is not only easy to do but

also incredibly rewarding. Herbs can be grown either in pots or directly in the ground. Keep in mind that mint is very aggressive and will quickly take over your garden, so it's best to plant it in containers. Some species of rosemary and lavender form large bushes and will need room to do so.

If you are planting directly in the ground, choose a site that gets at least six hours of direct sunlight. (Mint can take some shade.) Mix in both compost and sphagnum moss to lighten up the existing soil and provide proper drainage.

Once planted, herbs require little attention. As with most plants, herbs do not like soil that's too wet. It is generally ideal for the soil to be slightly cool and moist to the touch. Little fertilization if any is required. Fertilization actually detracts from an herb's flavor.

Herbs rarely suffer from severe disease or insect damage, but in case they do, fight them with an organic method such as ladybugs, neem oil, or one of the Safer[®] brand products.

To harvest herbs, pinch off or snip with a pair of scissors. This will also encourage fuller growth. It is always best to harvest early in the day. Most of the common herbs will stay with you throughout the years, with the exception of basil and cilantro, which are annuals that will die off each year, and parsley, which is a biennial that lasts two years.

Enjoy in your favorite recipes and use to flavor and garnish summer drinks!



✓ Tomatoes: Make sure to give seedlings plenty of room for growth. If plants are too close, growth will be stunted. Once plants sprout their first

Once plants sprout their first leaves, transplant into at least 4-inch pots. Plant tomatoes deeper than the pot they come in—all the way up to a few of the lower leaves. After the plants are about 3-feet high, remove the leaves from the bottom foot of the stem, the first place where fungus can develop due to less sun exposure. Roma and Mama Mia varieties of tomatoes are some of the



• Watering: Make maximum use of scarce water by watering early in the morning or installing a drip irrigation system.

 Tree care: Newly planted trees should be deeply watered once a week. Fruit trees can be pruned, with apple trees thinned out after a June drop.

most flavorful.

Compost: Gather up and compost any fallen leaves or fruit to avoid the spread of diseases in your garden.

Mulch: Continue to apply mulch to maintain a
 2-inch layer to conserve moisture and discourage weeds.



• Vine plants: If you do not have a trellis, tomato cages work well for vine-type flowering plants, such as fuchsias, that need support in a planter.

- Grab bars should be situated vertically at tops of stairs, and bars or handrails placed in bathrooms where needed (towel racks should never be used for support). Disaster Prep for Pets

("Are You Ready" Series, Part 7)

Natural disasters—from earthquakes to wildfires and floods—can put pets in jeopardy and separate dogs and cats from their families. Here are some tips on planning ahead to keep pets safe.

Emergency Housing

If you are forced to evacuate your home, don't leave your pet behind. If it's not safe for you, it's not safe for your pet. Most disaster relief shelters do not admit animals, so explore emergency housing options for your pet in advance. Find out if any motels or hotels in the area accept guests with dogs or cats. Keep an up-to-date list of area veterinarians and kennels that might board your pet. Make arrangements for temporary pet housing with friends or family members.

Identification

Make sure your pet wears an identification tag at all times. Your telephone may not work in the wake of a disaster, so I.D. tags should include a friend's or relative's phone number as well as your own. Keep a supply of write-on I.D. tags, in case you are forced to leave your home. Make sure your pet wears a tag with its new address, however temporary. Talk to your veterinarian about microchipping. A tiny microchip, implanted under the skin, serves as a permanent identification for your pet. Have several close-up photos and a record of your pet's size, weight, and special markings. If your dog or cat is lost, you can use this information to prepare posters and flyers. It will also identify you as the owner if your pet is found.

Other Precautions

Secure bird cages, aquariums, and small-animal habitats with tie-downs or brackets, and make sure they have latches or locks, so your pet won't escape. Accustom your cat or dog to a carrier or portable kennel that can be used for temporary shelter.



Emergency Pet Supplies

Put together a kit for your pet and keep it with your other emergency supplies. Include:

- A week's supply of food and fresh water
- Lightweight food bowls
- Can opener
- Portable carrier or crate
- Copies of your pet's up-to-date vaccination certificates
- A fresh supply of any medication your pet needs and a copy of the prescription
- A leash and collar for dogs
- A leash and collar or harness for cats
- Portable litter box and litter
- hydrogen peroxide, elastic tape, eye wash, ear litter cleaning solutions, and K-Y jelly

Refurbishing Gas Grills

Before you heat up a gas grill that hasn't been used in a while, make sure that it is in working order, using these tips as a guideline

- Turn off and disconnect the propane tank, then remove the cooking grates and burner cover bars. If they look rusty or there is deep pitting, replace them with new ones. If not, soak them in warm water and clean with a scouring pad.
- Remove the warming rack, replace it with a new one if needed, and scrub, clean, or replace the burners. If the holes in the burners are clogged, poke through with a small sharp tool.
- Scrape the inside of the grill and hood with a putty knife and then spray with degreaser and let sit for 10–15 minutes. Rinse off with a hose and scrub off any remaining gunk. Rinse and repeat. Let it dry thoroughly after it is clean.
- Replace any buttons and functions that have stopped working. Reassemble the grill.



Gas Grilling Safety

A successful barbecue is a safe barbecue, so take precautions-planning and common sense will prevent accidents and injuries.

Propane tank safety:

- Using soapy water, check tank and valve for leaks. Open the valve, but leave the appliance off while testing.
- Never store a spare tank beneath a grill.
- Always store tanks upright.
- Never store a tank in temperatures over 125°F.
- When transporting, secure tank upright in a wellventilated area of your vehicle. Drive directly to where it will be used. Do not allow tank to sit in a vehicle unattended.
- Never use or store a propane tank indoors.
- If storing a grill indoors, move disconnected tank to a secure, well-ventilated location outdoors.
- Do not attempt to repair a damaged tank or tank valve; take a damaged tank to a qualified propane supplier for repairs or disposal.

Propane grill safety:

- Always follow manufacturer's instructions for assembly, operation, maintenance, repair, and storage. Consult the owner's manual!
- Always turn control knobs to OFF and tank valve to CLOSED when grill is not in use.
- Make sure the tank has the right connection for vour grill.
- Inspect grill and tank before each use for damage or wear. Replace worn grill parts as needed, especially hose(s) and regulators.
- Never operate a grill if parts are damaged, missing, or improperly installed.
- Before lighting grill, always open the grill lid.
- Never move a grill that is in use.
- Position grill well away from siding, deck railings, and overhanging eaves and branches.
- Never allow children to operate or play around a grill. Declare a 3-foot "safe zone" around it.
- · Use long-handled utensils and flame-retardant mitts to avoid burns.
- Use baking soda to control grease fires.
- · Have a fire extinguisher handy.
- To reduce flare-ups, trim excess fat from meats, replace greasy lava rocks or ceramic briquettes, and keep the grill clean.
- Wipe the grill with a clean cloth after using a wire brush.






