In the Garden October Garden Tasks

Tips from Dennis and Bill

Hopefully, your garden endeavors have yielded abundant harvests and robust plants for you this October. There is a good chance we will enjoy a typical Bay Area Indian summer this month, providing continued pleasant weather to work in the yard. But as the weather starts to cool, it is not time to put away your gardening tools and gloves just yet—October is one of the best months to plant everything from perennials to annual seeds to shrubs and trees.

✓ Trees and shrubs should be fed twice a year—in spring and again now in fall. We recommend Espoma Plant-tone®. (Sku 7122930, \$9.99) Sprinkle around the drip line of the plant and work into the soil, taking care not to damage plant roots. Water thoroughly.



✓ Most veggie plants require a full six hours of sun per day. Since fall provides fewer hours of daylight than the summer, you may need to relocate your plot before planting your cool season crops.



✓ Purchase spring-flowering bulbs and plant daffodil, narcissus, iris, and crocus. Plant in full sun in a well-drained area, as overly wet soil will lead to fungus and disease for your bulbs. Chill tulip and hyacinth bulbs in the refrigerator and wait until November to plant them.

✓ Feed established azaleas, camellias, and rhododendrons a bud-and-bloom promoting formula. E.B. Stone™ Organic Ultra Bloom™ plant food is a good choice. (Sku 745024, \$9.99)



✓ Sow wildflower seeds now for spring blooms, including larkspur, nigella, and sweet pea. All you need to do is clear an



area, throw the seeds, cover with a fine layer of compost, and mist.

✓ If you are replanting veggies in your summer plot, remove any debris and pull weeds before they go to seed. Fluff compacted soil and add any amendments

needed for your new plants. Finally, a 2-inch layer of compost or fertilizer will give your plants an extra boost of nutrients.

✓ Rake up any fallen leaves and pull up drying annuals. Fall cleanup is important to keeping your garden free of pests and disease.



✓ Divide any overgrown perennials now. On an overcast day, water the plant thoroughly and then dig it up and split the roots into smaller plants with a sharp garden knife or shovel. Plant these newly divided plants at the same depth as the original was, water well, and shade for a few days.

✓ Consider soil amendments to boost the color of your hydrangea blooms. These perennials adore rich, well-drained soil. To get a pinker hue, add Espoma Garden Lime to your soil (Sku 7304959, \$7.49); for a bluer color, add Espoma Soil Acidifier (Sku 7312242, \$12.99). White hydrangeas cannot be manipulated to other shades, but they may change color with age.



✓ Discourage snails and slugs by placing crushed eggshells, saucers of beer, or coffee grounds around plants. Or try Sluggo®. (Sku 7117120, \$10.49)

Cool Season Vegetables

Cool season vegetables are heartier varieties that tolerate, and even thrive, in cold soil. Importantly, soil temperature must be in the 40s for cool season vegetable seeds to germinate. Simply go by the general rule that soil is warm enough when you can easily turn it with a shovel. Here are some cool season vegetable suggestions worth trying:

• **Lettuce:** Hail, Caesar! Nothing like fresh romaine lettuce for your salad. It takes but a little time, space, and energy. And lettuce always tastes best when it matures in cool weather.

• **Onions:** They can be started three ways: sets, seeds, or transplants. Planting sets is easiest. If you can poke a hole in the ground, you can plant an onion set.

• **Carrots:** For long, straight carrots, plant them in raised beds or sandy loam soil free of stones. Sweet, tender young carrots make a wonderful snack.

• **Broccoli:** It might not be everyone's favorite, but it ought to be. It's really good for you and easy to start with seeds.

Other plants to try include kale, cauliflower, radishes, turnips, cabbage, brussels sprouts, and cover crops such as fava beans. These plants should be ready to eat beginning in January and continuing into spring. If space is an issue, containers are a great alternative.

Five Hot Tips for Cool Season Success

1. To get the most vegetables throughout the year, plant cool season veggies now, follow them with warm season veggies in the spring and summer, and then replant more cool season veggies in the fall.

2. Choose a well-drained spot that gets as much sun as possible. This kind of space is likely to provide warmer soil temperatures.

3. Use a shovel to turn the soil. Add some organic matter such as compost along with some Garden-tone herb and vegetable food. (Sku 7135155, \$9.99)



4. Water deeply, but less frequently. Plants in general need less water in cooler weather.

5. Plant seeds or plants according to the directions found on the seed packets or plant tags.

If you can't wait to get your hands dirty in the garden, there's no reason to get left out in the cold. Give cool season crops a try!

Mycorrhizae are tiny fungi that attach to the roots of plants for improved plant growth, better nutrient uptake, bigger fruits and vegetables, more abundant flower yield, improved disease resistance, and reduced transplant shock. Safe at Home

Disasters—especially earthquakes—create fire hazards, including broken gas mains and gas leaks, which can be ignited by sparks or open flames. With care, you can protect your family and home. October is Fire Prevention Month, providing a reminder to check your home for safety as well as to minimize fire risks.

Fire Prevention

- Secure gas heaters and use flexible gas hoses in gas-powered appliances. Know how to identify gas leaks. Signs of a leak include a strong gas smell and a rapidly moving gas meter (check the wheels without numbers, found above or below the row of numbered wheels). If there is a gas leak, shut down the gas main in your building. Remember, once you shut off your gas, only the power company can turn it back on.

- Check all product labels for flammability. Keep flammable liquids (solvents, fuels, acetone, pressurized cans) away from water heaters and stoves. Keep flammable materials away from heat sources. For example, keep curtains, upholstered furnishings, and bedding away from portable heaters.

Fire Preparation

- Emergency ladders: If all or part of your home is above the ground floor, keep a sturdy rope or emergency ladder in all upper floors (make sure they are long enough to reach the ground safely).

- Fire extinguishers: The National Fire Protection Association recommends at least one extinguisher for



every 600 square feet of living area. Fire extinguishers should be located on every level of a building, and kitchens, garages, and basements should each have their own. Do not mount extinguishers close to a location where a fire might occur (such as near a stove)—you should not risk reaching into a fire or going into a burning area to get a fire extinguisher. Put a date on each extinguisher (with permanent ink) and have it checked by a professional every three years. Check it yourself twice a year (use the spring and fall time changes as your cue). Make sure the needle is still in the green zone and invert the extinguisher slowly, five times, to insure the materials in it have not settled. Note: Once an extinguisher is used, even partially, you must have it recharged by a professional! Consider purchasing a 5-pound, 3A 40BC fire extinguisher with a metal valve and trigger. Metal handles are sturdier than plastic, and the rubber hose helps to aim the extinguishing agent. (Sku 83559, \$54.99)



Accident Prevention

- Self-adhesive safety treads help prevent slips and falls in heavy traffic areas. Install on steps, ladders, and ramps. The nonslip tread design provides traction in a wide range of applications. Available in assorted colors in a 2-inch x 5-yard roll. (Sku 1009273, \$16.99)



- Velcro® reusable ties are adjustable cord straps that can bundle cords to secure them safely out of harm's way. Pack of 50. (Sku 5369707, \$6.99)

Time Change Reminder

Sunday, November 1

Clocks are moved one hour back this year on Sunday, November 1, at 2:00 am. If you set your clocks back on Saturday night, October 31, before you go to bed, you'll awaken Sunday morning to the correct time. While this means we gain a precious hour of sleep, it also means that it gets darker an hour earlier.



Well-lit entryways help prevent accidents, as well as discourage would-be burglars. Motion-activated lighting turns on when movement is sensed and saves energy.

Both decorative and floodlight styles are available, and many models feature a sensitivity control to adjust the range for sensing motion and to select the length of time the light stays on after motion has been detected. At the recommendation of fire departments across the country, take this opportunity to also check the batteries in your smoke detectors or install new ones.

Gutter Maintenance

Plugged gutters and downspouts can be worse than none at all. It's best to check and clean your gutters and downspouts twice a year: in the spring after the winter rains and in the fall before the next rainy season. If big trees are near, clean gutters more often.

All you need to get started is a ladder, work gloves, a bucket, a garden hose, and motivation.



Galvanized gutters are sturdy enough to lean a ladder against, but aluminum gutters are not. When in doubt, use a step ladder or stabilizer. Make sure the ladder is absolutely safe before you climb it!

With a gloved hand, reach into the gutter and sweep it for debris. Put it in a bucket and haul it down or simply drop the debris on the ground to clean up later. When you think you've got that stretch of gutter clean, hook up the garden hose and run a hefty volume of water through the whole system. This will flush out anything that is remaining as well as let you know if the downspout is working.

As you are cleaning, keep an eye out for areas that may need repair. COLE HARDWARE carries a full assortment of caulk and patching materials. Performing repairs in wet weather is not just a drag for you—it also limits your choice of repair materials. So be sure to do your cleaning when there is dry weather on the horizon.

Rain Ready!

If the predictions are as accurate as the hype, we will be in for a healthy dose of rain this winter. Despite the lack of creeks and streams in our urban areas, we can still experience flooding. Be ready for the rain, so you can enjoy it!

Clean storm drains: Flooding can easily occur when storm drains are clogged with leaves and debris. Make sure any drains around your home are clear. City maintenance crews do clean the storm drains, but you can bet that if we have a big storm, they will have their hands full.



Tarp and bucket:

Lantern: There's no need to use candles when the power is out, when there are hundreds of inexpensive LED lantern options. Don't Dump!

You see it all the time in urban environments: old couches, chairs, mattresses, and other ratty furniture and appliances left on the sidewalk. Oftentimes, there will be a handwritten sign exclaiming that this worn piece of furniture is free! Illegal dumping costs taxpayers millions of dollars each year and increases blight in neighborhoods. While most of us are law-abiding citizens, a few others aren't so responsible.

What to do about it?

If you see something dumped on the street, report it to 311 or download the 311 app on your smartphone to report the incident. In Oakland, call the City of Oakland Public Works Agency Call Center at **510/615-5566** or download the ClickFix app to send photos and report the dumping.



San Francisco residents are entitled to one free bulky item collection up to 10 times per year. Contact Recology, the City refuse company, at www.recyclemyjunk.com or **415/330-1300** to schedule a pickup and for more information.

In Oakland, single-family residences (four units or less) are eligible for one free pickup per calendar year. Visit www.stopwaste.org/guide to find ideas on how to best reuse or recycle bulky items. To discard items that are not reusable or recyclable, call Waste Management of Alameda County (WMAC) to schedule a pickup. Appointments are not available the first two weeks of January when holiday tree collection is in effect. Call **510/537-5500** to schedule an appointment.

Must be in plastic bags to avoid leakage.

SOFT PLASTIC:

Clean plastic only. Households only. One basketball-size amount per visit, please.

PRODUCT KNOWLEDGE

Ladders

Many homes in San Francisco feature high ceilings, making even simple tasks such as changing a light bulb difficult sometimes. A reliable ladder is useful and necessary around the house. For safety and practical purposes, choose a ladder to suit your needs.

The three basic types of ladders are extension (straight), step, and multipurpose. Ladders are rated by load capacity into household, commercial, and industrial grades (see the duty rating chart). Ladder rungs are either flat, round, or "D" shaped. The minimum size considered acceptable for round rungs is 1 1/4", and 1 1/2" for "D" rungs. To insure safety, rungs are required to be capable of carrying a much higher load than the rated load for the entire ladder.

When choosing a ladder, take the following requirements into consideration.

Type of Activity Involved

The type of activity dictates what type of ladder you'll need. Use a stepladder for interior painting, spackling, installing drywall, and hanging wallpaper. Stepladders include step stools and platform ladders, generally for home or light commercial use. Stepladders are self-supporting and may include a pail hook or shelf. Extension

ladders are best for painting exteriors, cleaning gutters, replacing shutters and siding, and so on.

Demands of the Application

Make sure the ladder is suitable for the physical demands of the application. The rated load capacity must exceed the maximum aggregate weight of the user along with his or her clothing and tools. Duty ratings are also color coded (see duty rating chart). Look for the proper duty ratings to match your highest level of use.

Height the Ladder Must Reach

For a climber to work from a safe position, the ladder's top should extend about 3 feet

above the working surface when in use. Stepladders should be high enough for the user not to have to stand above the second step from the top. On extension ladders, stand no higher than four rungs from the top.

Use the size chart to determine what size extension ladder to buy to reach the roof of your home (for painting, cleaning gutters, and so on) or for any other outdoor needs you might have.

Basic Material

Common ladder materials are wood, aluminum, and fiberglass. Wood ladders are nonconductive when clean and dry. Wood also provides a natural, firm grip for feet and hands. However, wood tends to be heavy and is vulnerable to moisture/rot. Aluminum is lightweight and strong, but it does conduct electricity—aluminum ladders should never be used when working near energized electrical lines. Fiberglass offers a blend of desirable qualities. It is nonconductive and strong—an excellent choice for a variety of circumstances.

Ladder Safety Tips

DO

- Learn the proper methods for working with a ladder.
- Keep your ladders well maintained (for wood, treat with a wood preservative that leaves a clear surface).
- Choose duty ratings to match the highest level of use.

DON'T

- Use or repair a bent or damaged ladder.
- Test a ladder by jumping on it.
- Use a ladder on slippery surfaces or uneven ground.
- Place ladder feet on power cords or come in contact with electrical current or power lines.
- Climb down a ladder with your back to the ladder or carrying a load in your arms.
- Overreach, lean to one side, or stand on one foot.
- Hurry or skip steps when getting on or off the ladder.
- Leave a ladder unattended.
- Position a ladder where it blocks foot traffic or where it could be bumped by a door.
- Place a ladder on boxes, chairs, furniture, or other moveable objects to try to climb higher.
- Climb from one ladder to another or try to move a ladder while on it.
- Climb a ladder when ill or using drugs or alcohol.
- Drop or throw ladders.
- Paint a wooden ladder (paint hides damage and can create a slippery surface for climbing).


